What a pleasure to be able to welcome you to the December edition of the Newsletter. In my first newsletter as Headteacher, may I start by **wishing you all the most wonderful Christmas** to you and your family on behalf of us all at Parbold Douglas.

This year, at Parbold Douglas we are focusing on the theme of **JOY** – and what a better time of the year to highlight Joy than at Christmas time!

Joy is an integral part of our school community – we believe primary school should be **full of Joy**. From ice pops under the oak tree to discos, from residential trips to collecting 85kg of food for the local food bank – we see our mission is to provide joy for the children and in turn encourage them to be 'Kingdom Builders' out in our community as JOY-spreaders.

The school has been bustling with events throughout the Autumn term and we are getting into the Christmas spirit. This year, we are focusing on how we can help provide Joy, Love and Hope to those in need at Christmas time. In partnership with the awesome charity Stable Lives in Parbold (mental health charity supporting families in crisis), we are helping them prepare for their Christmas Nativity event. This event welcomes 300 children and adults to take part in a nativity walk, learning about the true meaning of Christmas, followed by an elf workshop and meeting Father Christmas. For many who attend, the presents provided are the *only presents they will get this Christmas*. Through the wrapping of teddy bears and collection of presents, our school community is hoping to provide masses presents for the event.
